




Fertility and abortion rates

Slovenia 1981-2010, women aged 15-49 yrs




Fertility and abortion rates

Slovenia 1981-2010, adolescents aged 15-19 yrs




% of all live births to mothers, age under 20 years



Adolescent pregnancies (abortions, live-births)


No. per 1.000 women aged 15-19 yrs, Europe, 1996


















The rates of sexual active 15-year-olds (Slovenia, HBSC 2001/2002, 2005/2006 in 2009/2010)










Contraceptive choices in adolescents


- Condom
- Hormonal contraception
- Emergency contraception

- Double protection (against unwanted pregnancy and STI)
 - Condom: consistent use
 - Double method: condom + other reliable contraception



ABC approach

- Abstinence abstinence from risky sexual behaviour
- Be faithful faithfulness and use of reliable contraception; lessen the number of sexual partners
- Condom condom +/other reliable contraception



The increase in reliable contraception use

- Improved knowledge on contraception among Slovenian gynaecologists
- Introduction of evidence-based medicine into everyday practice
- A+B+C approach
- Accessible reproductive health care
- Despite non-mandatory sex education in schools

Conclusions

- Trends in increase in sexual activity of adolescents is diminishing – median age at 1. sex. intercourse is 17.6 yrs
- Slovenia has the lowest rate of adolescent pregnancies in EU
- 85% of sexually active secondary-school students used reliable contraception at the last intercourse
- Health professionals are the most appropriate source of information on sexuality
